- Beginning from Monday, 24 January 2022, and up to the Chinese New Year holidays, staff will

 security, safety and essential maintenance.
- Unit heads should use discretion to make special arrangements where necessary.
- Winter courses and examinations will all switch to online mode unless instructed otherwise by the course instructors.
- During the Add-Drop period of the Spring semester, the default mode of delivery for all classes
 will be real-time online. Lab classes and TPg programs may make their own arrangements. We
 are closely monitoring the development of the pandemic, and will further communicate if there
 are changes to Spring semester arrangements.
- Catering outlets will continue to operate per relevant government policy, and more information about the arrangements during the CNY holidays will be announced later.
